

# **The highlight of Munich's Art Autumn 2026: the ARTMUC international art fair**

**Friday 23 to Sunday 25 October 2026**

**Time for new international art – at ARTMUC!**

**From Friday 23rd to Sunday 25th October, the state capital will once again be all about international art: ARTMUC, Bavaria's largest art event and the highlight of Munich's Art Autumn, is bringing more than 190 international galleries, projects and artists to Munich and will be showcasing the diversity of the global art market over three days.**

With more than 190 juried international artists, galleries and collectives, ARTMUC is once again presenting a broad international spectrum of artistic perspectives this autumn.

With participants from more than 15 countries, the international art scene is once again showcased at this year's event. The range of works on display at ARTMUC extends from painting to sculpture, collage, photography and digital art. Participants come from countries including Portugal, Switzerland, the UK, Austria, Italy, France, Belgium, Spain and overseas, such as Australia, Korea, Brazil, etc.

The current autumn edition also features international galleries and projects that have been active at other international fairs such as Art Karlsruhe, ART Basel Hong Kong and ART Busan – including Tableau Gallery from Seoul, South Korea; Gallery Steiner from Vienna, Austria; and ARTLAB Gallery from Ponzano Veneto, Italy; as well as, as a special highlight, Sheen Gallery from Shanghai, China.

However, ARTMUC also places a strong emphasis on local ties and supports Munich-based institutions such as the 'Gesellige Vereinigung Bildender Künstler Münchens e.V.' (GVbKM), which will once again be showcasing its members in a dedicated exhibition space at the event in October.

## **International global**

The focus on international art and networks, which has been developing for several years now, centres primarily on China this year. Following the presentation by Chinese collector Yan Sun in May, the ARTMUC team, led by organiser Raiko Schwalbe, is inviting the young SHEEN GALLERY from Shanghai to ARTMUC for an intercultural exchange.

Founded in Shanghai in 2025, Sheen Gallery sees itself as a metaphysical narrator of the present and has set itself the task of acting as a spiritual hub for art, where Eastern wisdom and global visions converge within today's cultural landscape.

At ARTMUC in autumn 2026, four artists from the Sheen Gallery will explore the dialogue between the metaphysical and the physical. In keeping with the spirit of the I Ching, which states: 'That which is beyond form is the Tao; that which is within form is the tool', the artists build a bridge between these two realms:

YANG Yanlaimit with her 'Guan Ying' series, inspired by the Book of Songs. The birds and clouds create a spiritual utopia in which Chinese tradition merges with folk art, providing us with a key to unlock the door to our longing for idyll and pure love. LIU Yingcong with the 'Simulation' series, which questions visual reality. Furthermore, CHEN Jiayi, with her 'Qi Xie Ying Zhi' series, which returns to

primordial myths and the earth, and WANG Chunwei, with portraits that transcend form to depict the soul, will be presented to the Munich public in a 'Förderkoje' as part of the autumn edition of ARTMUC.

### **Taking responsibility – helping**

Since its foundation in 2014, the ARTMUC art fair has supported various social projects at every edition. For the current autumn edition, ARTMUC is once again collaborating with Soroptimist – an NGO and the world's largest organisation of working women committed to socio-political causes – with a focus on women active in Munich. ARTMUC aims to provide support for a socially highly relevant initiative 'Women experiencing homelessness – protection and assistance' and to raise awareness of the issue amongst the wider public. To this end, ARTMUC intends to generate donations in the form of artworks by the participating artists, with the proceeds going towards the Soroptimist project.

The stated aim of ARTMUC is to provide a platform for young, up-and-coming artists, enabling them to showcase their work to a wide audience and sell their art directly to visitors on site. ARTMUC focuses on significantly increasing the visibility and support of artists, as well as enhancing Munich's reputation as a city of art and culture.

ARTMUC is well worth a visit, as it's rare to find so much art, inspiration and fun all in one weekend. And if you spot a piece of art you like, you can buy it, take it home and hang it up in your own flat straight away.
